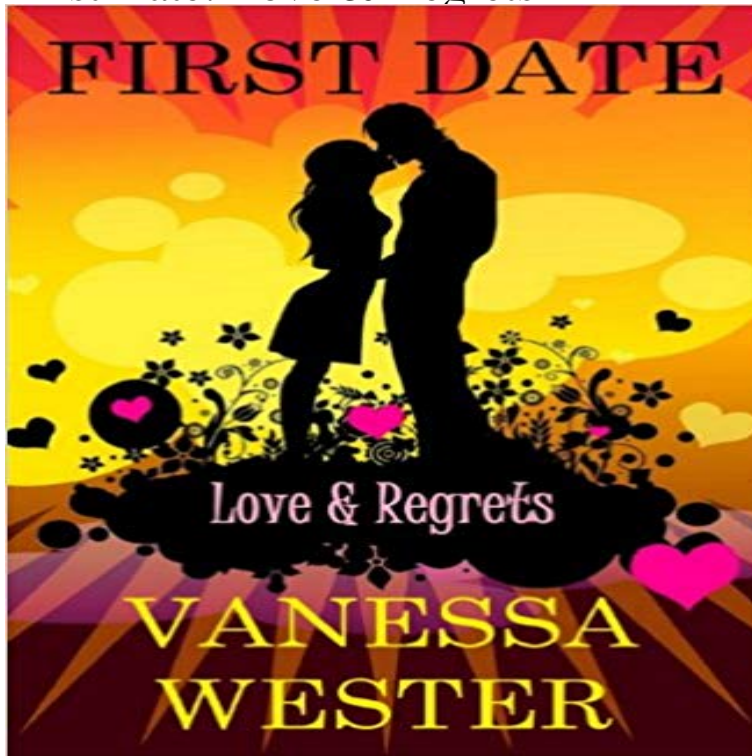


## First Date: Love & Regrets
