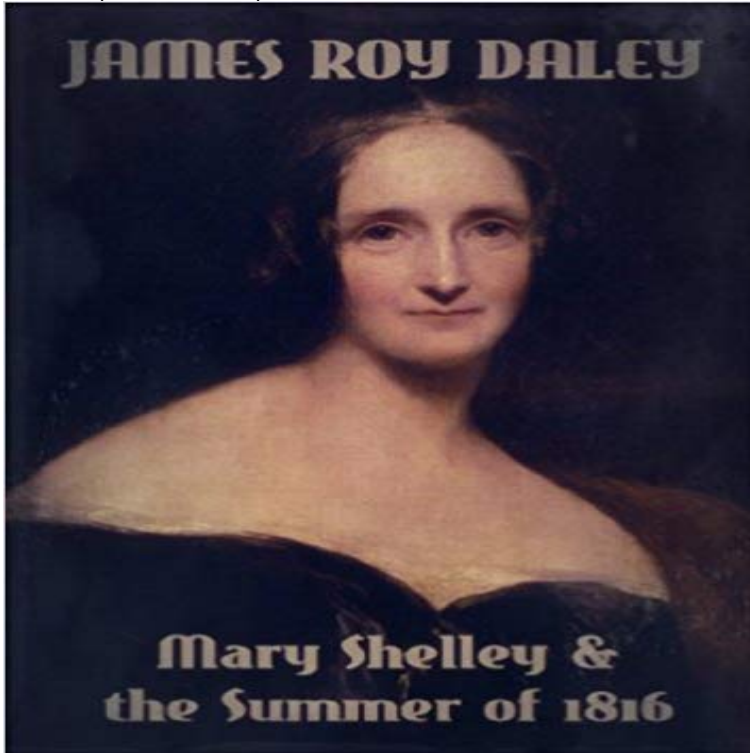


Mary Shelley & the Summer of 1816
