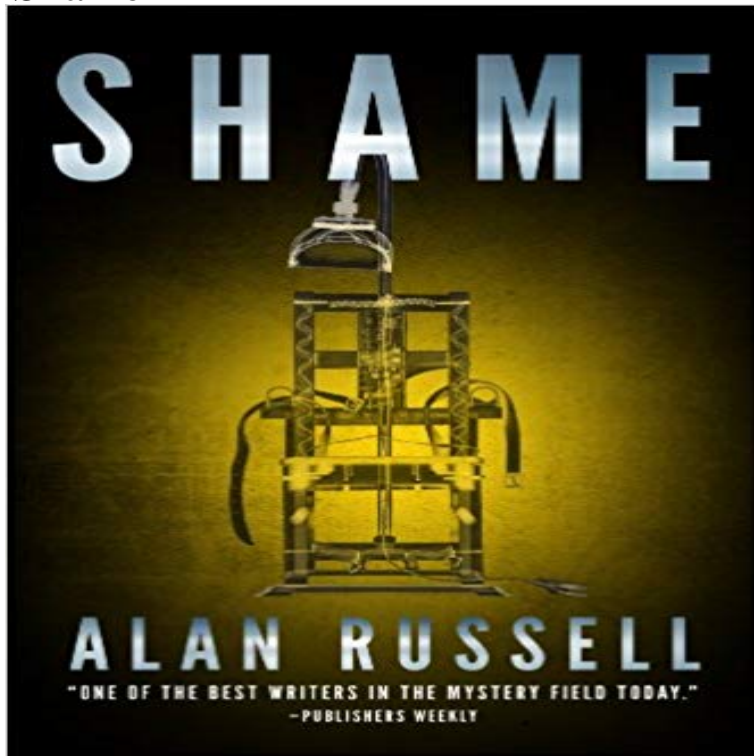


Shame
