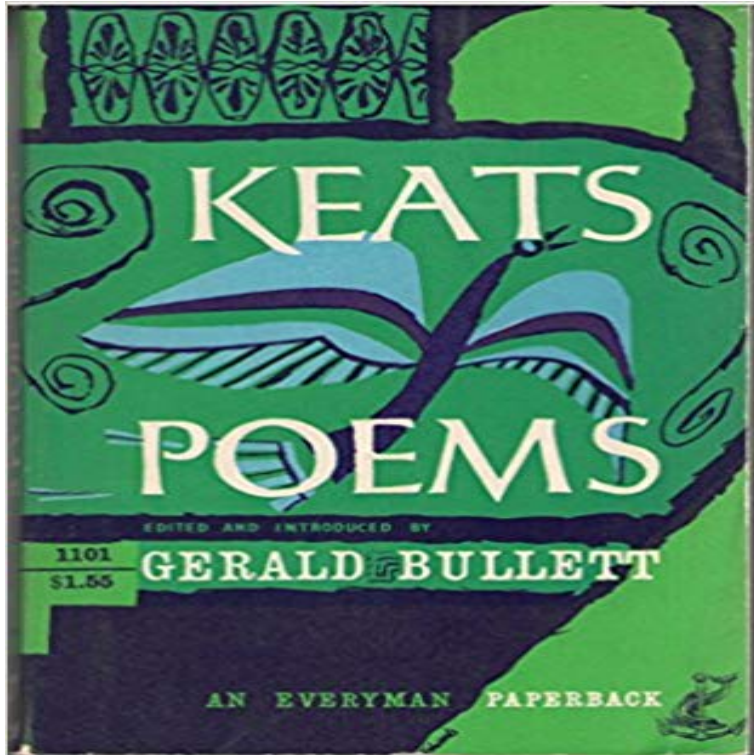


John Keats Poems



The poems by which he lives for us bulk small in his collected verse, but those few are beyond price: a lyric here and a ballad there, two or three sonnets, five matchless odes, a narrative in forty-two Spenserian stanzas, and a noble epic fragment exhibiting an unexpected virtuosity.
