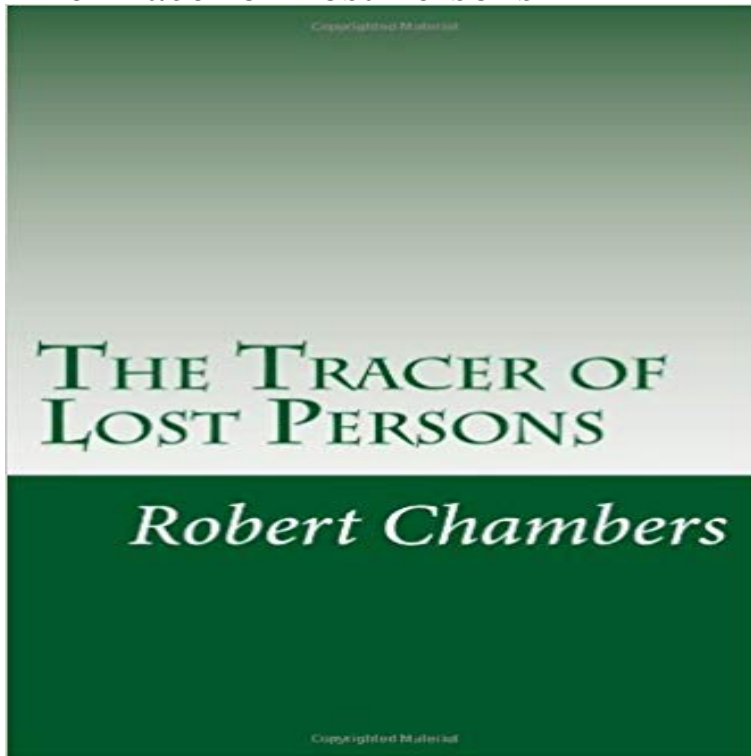


The Tracer of Lost Persons
